Madeline Kaplan, author of "Planet Earth Gets Geen" on Radio Green Earth of South Florida



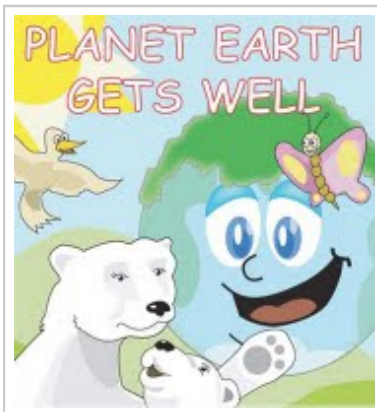
